

This is a whole school and community event.






FRONT OF SCHOOL

Earlier in the year a small working party came together to make some plans for the refurbishment of the front of the school following the removal of the classroom block. After careful planning, a proposal for the area has been presented to the Governing Council, staff, students and the school community for consultation and feedback. A copy of the plan is shown below which will include areas of shade, outside learning areas and garden beds to soften the front of the school.

The re-development will continue to take shape over the holidays with a walking path across the grass area planned with the help of Burdett Concreting. The planting of some trees in the paving area and grassed garden beds will hopefully take place prior to summer and the planned fence across the front of the school and car park area is also on track for installation in the Christmas break. Additional parts of the plan including plantings in the garden beds and seating around the trees is ear-marked for 2024.

The working party are keen for more help with this project including at working bees and in the planning stages especially with the garden beds. It would be great to see as many families as possible become involved in transforming the front of our school.

2023 BEBRAS CHALLENGE – ROUND 2

Bebras is an international initiative aiming to promote Computer Science among school students at all ages. The Bebras challenge is open twice a year to Australian Students in Years 3-12, and engages students' computational thinking and problem-solving skills in a fun, interactive environment. The challenge is free and helps schools introduce computational thinking to their students.

The Bebras international community has grown to 60 countries with over 2.9 million students participating worldwide! Bebras Australia began in 2014 and is now administered through the CSIRO. Lucindale Primary students have participated in this challenge for the second year. This year we had 29 students participate in the CSIRO Bebras Challenge and this year we achieved 15 awards. COMMISSIONERS DIGITAL CHALLENGE 2023

The Commissioners Digital Challenge has three different sections for students to participate;

Space To Dream – Design Thinking (navy certificate)

Learn to Speak Robot – Digital Thinking. (yellow certificate)

Zoom Out – Systems Thinking (teal certificate)

This year the Year 5/6 and Year 3/4 classes both participated in the 'Space To Dream' challenges. Students went through the Design Process to invent a toy for a child to take to Mars. The students watched a video of an astronaut talk about her experiences in space travel and introduced features that the students will need to consider throughout the process. Students created 6 different ideas, selected two of their ideas and developed further, shared with their peers for feedback on how they could improve on their design concepts and finally produced a detailed drawing of their toy concept using 3D Makers Empire App and illustration. All participating students received a Certificate of Participation for their efforts.

The Year 3/4 class participated in the other two challenges as well. The 'Learn to Speak Robot' involved doing coding exercises. The students worked on computational coding using arrows, Scratch programming in Code.org lessons and LEGO Essential Scenarios Block Coding throughout the year. Within the 'Zoom Out' Challenge, the whole class participated together on a series of micro-activities based on systems all around us. Students looked at the whole system from a broad perspective, rather than a jumble of computer parts. It was an approach to thinking that can help students predict future outcomes based upon understanding of how these parts of a system contribute to the whole. Systems are everywhere around you – and behave in different ways. There are different body systems, space systems and even literacy systems eg Words are systems of letters, sentences are systems of words, books are systems of sentences and libraries are systems of books. Students earnt a participation certificate for their learning throughout the year.

MEASUREMENT WITH THE YEAR 7'S

This Term Year 7 have been working on a unit of measurement. As part of the unit students completed a measurement investigation. Students were asked to do some research and find a building that inspires them, annotate the image and describe the 3D shape composites in their chosen building.

Students then designed their own building. Students used nets to create various 3D shapes. They used a 1cm grid to outline a floorplan and created a 3D model to view, drawing various elevations of their model. Students used their model to construct an isometric drawing,

Students calculated volume and surface areas of the 3D objects that make up their building.

A strong sense of community is what drives SA Ambulance Service (SAAS) Regional Team Leader Taylor Martin.

Taylor grew up in Kingston SE and has returned to the region recently to take on the leadership role looking after the volunteer teams in Kingston, Robe and Lucindale.

Training volunteers and watching them take on new skills is rewarding to the Robe local.

"I am grateful to have the opportunity to give back to the community in this capacity," Taylor said.

"I feel the volunteers are responsible for keeping the ambulance service going and all of the credit should go to them," she said.

Kingston, Robe and Lucindale are all looking for volunteers in SAAS's recruitment drive Answer the Call.

Taylor said new volunteers would be most welcome, and they would be joining teams which were made up of people from diverse backgrounds.

"We have farmers, teachers, nurses, scientists and even a psychologist within my teams," she said.

"It is great to be surrounded by selfless, kind and a community driven group of people."

Taylor can also see the fun in working with a community she grew up in.

"Several volunteers have known me since I was a child, for example, Pauline Parsons who taught me in primary school and Vicki Natt who was the local postie, are both volunteers at Kingston."

Volunteers join the service from all walks of life, and no prior medical knowledge is required.

SAAS provides training, uniform and reimburses out of pocket costs such as travel and childcare. A fully qualified volunteer Ambulance Officer is awarded a Certificate IV in Healthcare, and volunteers and their families also receive free Ambulance Cover whilst volunteering for their communities with SAAS.
