Our smooth start to the year has continued this past fortnight. Students are working hard in their classrooms with their learning. Our teachers and Student Support Officers continue to have high level expectations of students to support their

learning. We are all working towards providing high level teaching and learning programs that meet the needs of every student at our school. Thank you, parents/caregivers, for your support with helping your children understand and follow our school expectations. Through working together, we will continue to see Lucindale Area School students achieving to their highest and personal best levels.

It is extremely important to maintain open communication between parents and teachers. Parents are encouraged to notify their child's teacher of any concerns and to make an appointment at a mutually convenient time before or after school. The easiest way to make an appointment is either by or via the front office. When emailing, depending on the situation please consider if an email or a face-to-face meeting would be more beneficial for your child's learning.

In relation to emails, I need to reinforce that there are no expectations from me that staff members are to be communicating via email during the school day or after 5:30pm at night during the working week. Likewise, enquiries sent via email cannot always be answered or responded to immediately. My expectations are that a response, is sent pending further follow up/investigation, should be received within a maximum of 48 hours of sending the initial enquiry. Our staff are very professional, and service focused, but they also have many multi-faced daily requests, so I ask that you allow them time to address your queries professionally and in a realistic timeframe.

Students in Year 3 – 12 receive ongoing written and verbal feedback in class, from both their teacher and their peers; As they engage in a variety of learning activities designed to support both them and their teachers to understand where they are at and what the next step in their learning is. In a reporting point parents/caregivers will receive information to support their understanding of what their child has been working on, as well as what their child can do to continue to make progress. This Term all Year 11 and 12 students will receive a report so parents can see how they've progressed in their SACE so far. Conversations at home each day, can encourage students to reflect on their learning at home.

Year 3, 5, 7 & 9 NAPLAN – March 13 – 25 National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN). The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy is a series of tests focussed on basic skills that are administered annually to Australian students. These standardised tests assess students' reading, writing, language and numeracy and are administered by the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority. NAPLAN tests will occur in Term 1, March 2024. Students will practice the online system in Term 1 in preparation for testing. Parents wishing to withdraw their child must contact Johanna Kemplay-Hill to obtain a Withdrawal Form. The form must be submitted by Monday, 4th March.

Our school day starts at 8:30am when we have a duty of care for students arriving at school. Each day 8:50am bell and sounds directing students to their Homegroups to get organised for learning. Our school day concludes at 3:10pm. Our duty of care finishes at 3:20pm each afternoon. If you have any questions or concerns relating to these times, please come and see me at school. We are here to support students and families to be at school every possible day, ready to learn.

Just a reminder that the uniform of the school is a navy Polo Top and no other colour top to be worn. In winter only a navy Shell Jacket or navy Polar Fleece Jumper can be worn. No "Roos" jumper or black puffer jackets. The Year 10-12 can wear their Senior Jumper. Students can also wear the school Bucket Hat or a navy Bucket Hat with no wording on it.

Materials and Service charges. The school's 2024 Materials and Service charges for the Primary students (Reception – Year 6) will be voluntary and not legally recoverable because of an unsuccessful poll. The Middle and Senior School students (Year 7-12) is compulsory and therefore legally recoverable.

NUMBERS WITH THE RECEPTIONS

The Reception students have been working on identifying numerals, counting strategies and making connections about how numbers are used in everyday life. They have completed learning activities to support their understanding.

Activities have included:

- Counting songs
- Handwriting numbers using chalk on the quad, tracing using whiteboard markers, writing in our books
- Finding items to match a number given for example: find me 5 items students find 5 cars to show their understanding of what 5 represents.
- Finding numbers on a 'Number Hunt Walk' around the school yard
- Identifying numbers 1 10 in and out of sequence
- Ordering numbers 1 10 out of sequence
- Finding missing numbers to complete 1 –10 number sequence

Many students are also completing a School Based Apprenticeships which are regularly offered throughout the year – information about these will be emailed to the students and uploaded to the website as they arise.


Subject selections have been finalised with all students in year 11 and 12. Students have settled into the routines and many have started assessment tasks.

STUDENTS DRIVING TO SCHOOL

Many students obtain their Driver's Licence whilst at school and have their parents'/caregivers' permission to drive a vehicle. If parents/caregivers wish their child to drive to school, we fully support this decision.

The school has sent out an agreement form via EdSmart (as well as hardcopies) to obtain the following information in writing:

- 1. Parent/caregiver permission for the student to drive
- 2. Names of other passengers (non-siblings)

Both the school and the family are then fully aware of who is in the vehicle being driven to school and are then able to encourage due care and safety while on the roads. Students who wish to drive to and from school must complete the Student Driving to School Agreement form and ensure that it is signed by both the driver and one of their parents/caregivers.

Responsibilities:

- 1. The student must hold a current driver's licence.
- 2. Only the driver and APPROVED passengers may be transported in the vehicle. Generally, these passengers are siblings. Any changes to this must be advised in writing by the parent/caregiver. If a non-sibling passenger is to be approved, the parent/caregiver of this student must provide written notification.
- 3. The vehicle must not be used during the student's scheduled lesson times. Students may not access their vehicle during school time.
- 4. Students will not be permitted to park on the school property on school days. They must park in designated areas.
- 5. The School recommends that the car being driven by the students should be covered by insurance, at the very least, Third Party Property insurance.

Conditions: By signing the Student Driving to School Agreement form, it is accepted that both the student and the parent/caregiver understand and agree to abide by the following conditions:

- 1. Responsibility for driving in line with the conditions of licence will lie with the signatories.
- 2. The vehicle must be operated in accordance with SA law.
- 3. It is the students' responsibility to update vehicle and passenger details with the school.

LIONS YOUTH OF THE YEAR


YEAR 6 & 7 CANBERRA CAMP

• Be there to talk to



Encourage your student to talk about their school life. Even if your child doesn't want to talk, just let them know you'll be there to listen when they do.

• Draw from your own knowledge

If you have knowledge of one of your child's subjects, you can basically become their tutor. But even knowledge outside of subjects can be useful! Parents, you've been through school, you've been through more life than your child/ren have. Even if it's something simple, your knowledge can make a difference.

• Let them know you support and love them, regardless of the outcome

JUNIOR PRIMARY SCIENCE

Over the last fortnight Junior Primary students have continued their focus on minibeasts. Children have enjoyed watching our mealworms gradually transform into darkling beetles. Some even tried wriggling out of exoskeleton lab coats!

Reception students have been concentrating on the external features of insects prior to looking at other types of minibeasts. The Year 1/2 class have conducted investigations and were amazed at mealworms ability to eat Styrofoam without causing themselves any harm. The class is currently learning about the wide variety of minibeast habitats.











YEAR 3/4 HEALTH AND PHYSICAL EDUCATION

We have begun the term creating the alphabet with our bodies. Students had to work together in small groups to create the letters they were given. They had to check what the "human letters" looked like and make sure other students could work out the letter. This has developed skills such as our problem solving, teamwork, communication, spatial awareness and literacy.

We also discussed uppercase and lowercase letters and had to problem solve when the asphalt was too hot to lay on.



YEAR 3/4 CLASSROOM NEWS

The Year 3/4 class has been busily preparing for the Lucindale Show since the start of the school year in their Art time. We have made bookmarks, dioramas, decorated paper planes and decorated cutlery people, as well as painting and drawing about the circus. We are very excited that the show is here!

In Maths, the Year 3/4 class has been practicing place value with numbers and trying to write and read very large numbers. We were especially pleased to be able to show Her Excellency The Honourable Frances Adamson AC, the Governor of South Australia, how we can read numbers into the billions. She was very impressed! We have also been practicing 100 more, 100 less and 1 000 more and 1 000 less. Next, we are learning to break numbers into their parts by their place value so that we know that 542 is also 500+40+2.

Sports Day is coming up very soon and for some of the Year 3/4 class, this will be their first time participating in the full day. We have been busily learning all of the activities we will get to participate in on the day. We have also been practicing our team songs, just in case we win!

In Literacy, we have been learning about writing narratives. We looked at some Fairy Tales and worked out all of the parts we needed to include. We then put some ideas together to come up with some stories of our own. Alien chickens were a very popular idea! We are writing and illustrating some short stories to share with our new Reception buddies next door.

We made a fantastic display for the Lucindale Show all about our class. Make sure you check it out at the show and see our great work!









YEAR 3/4 DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

We have been learning the design process and how important it is to be successful. As a class each student designed a layered Jelly cup. We tasted the jelly flavours and decided what we liked. Then made our designs come to life. We all enjoyed our jelly and the process we learnt.

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) supports the Way2Go program promoting safe, free and more active travel for South Australian primary school students.


